Job Purpose

- To facilitate a learning experience which provides pupils with the opportunity to achieve their individual potential.
- To monitor and support the overall progress and development of pupils as Class Teacher.

- motivating pupils through interest, encouragement and recognition of their unique value;
- contributing to the production of the School Improvement Plan.
